2019 marked the third of the three-year bridging phase of the EUPATI programme, with the aim to focus on sustainability models to secure EUPATI's mid-, and long-term future, whilst continuing the delivery of three key pillars that make EUPATI a successful programme: The Patient Expert Training Course, the Toolbox, and the EUPATI National Platforms network.
